Dear Parent/Carer

SCHOOL EXAMINATIONS

A round of mocks have just been completed for Y11 and Y10 students. In most cases these take place in a formal setting and are administered exactly as a formal public examination would be. New specification GCSE's are much more demanding and last longer and require long periods of concentration and extended writing. We think, therefore it is extremely important that our students experience what this is like and practice as much as possible, to give them the best chance to do well when it comes to the real thing.
