The WINTERHILL WAY: SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS

As we approach the end of the first term a reminder to all students regarding our expectations around **uniform**, **attendance and punctuality.** Students must attend school in **full school uniform**, including a suitable school bag, their learning equipment, as well as brining their full PE kit as per their timetabled lessons. Full details of our uniform expectations can be found on our website. In particular please wear correct footwear and note that trainers of any kind are not permitted. As the weather starts to get colder, and whilst complying with our COVID measures around ventilation, students will be allowed to wear an additional item of clothing along with their school jumper whilst in school. This can be a Winterhill hoody, or a plain black, dark blue, dark grey hoody or jumper. Students are required to remove any outer coats on entry to the school.

As you would expect via our school ethos 'everyone succeeds', an attendance of **95%+**, as well as arriving at school **promptly at 08:45**, is vital to students achieving their full potential. Each week, our tutors engage students around their attendance and punctuality with weekly awards for achieving good attendance and arriving at school on time.

TEACHING AND LEARNING TERM 1

In English, Year 7 students have been studying poems on the theme of 'Growing up', looking at the ideas and representation of childhood through the ages. This has formed the foundation for some wonderful and interesting creative writing responses. Year 9 have been reading about different places around the world and then using this to inspire their own travel writing pieces. So far, they have visited Mexico, Australia, the Himalayas and Vietnam! In science, Year 7 have been exploring the solar system with some incredible models produced for homework. Well done everyone.

In History, Year 7 have spent this term looking at the impact of the Roman Empire in Britain, Year 9 have spent the first half of the term looking at the Holocaust and the lessons that need to be learnt from this period of History. In the second half of this term, Year 9's have spent time looking at the Slave Trade and the Middle Passage. Year 10's have spent the first half of the term looking at the Vietnam War and the consequences of this conflict. During the second half of this term, Year 10's have been recapping the Cold War and its consequences.

Across the curriculum for Year 11, they have been working incredibly hard in preparation for their mock exams which they undertook with resilience and have achieved incredibly well in. Well done Year 11!

WINTERHILL COMMUNITY

Winterhill students continue to support our local community with various projects running throughout the year. Over the past 6 years our students, along with local businesses and half a million pounds worth of grants have transformed the area around the Engine Pond across from the school. This would not have happened without the determination of our students and the profile of Winterhill. They have recently erected a sculpture and have taken part in a COP26 initiative for which they were given an award, they were chosen for this as there were no other student led projects in the area which provided such impact and longevity.

We continue to work closely with Wentworth Woodhouse and have our second Summer Ball arranged for our Year 11 leavers at the end of the school year. Some of our students have recently attended the 2nd Wentworth Woodhouse Forum Ambassadors meeting, where the students work on initiatives and events to attract more young people to the house. The students presented their ideas to the CEO's of Wentworth Woodhouse and have already booked in some big events for year ahead.

The prefect leadership team continue to develop and grow, with over fifty Year 10 and Year 11 students now involved, led by our Head and Deputy head boys and girls.

WINTERHILL WELLBEING

Mental health and wellbeing has been a main focus for the school this term. Our PHSE curriculum covers a wide and varied range of topics such as, a mental health overview, manging stress and anxiety, challenges for teenagers, Group tasks on helping others, how to give advice, Identity and bullying to name but a few. Our group tutor sessions continue to provide opportunities for our students to work alongside their peers to discuss these important topics and the support we can offer each other. We realise that for some students the challenges faced on returning to school have been particularly difficult and we are working with a number of external agencies to offer the support they need. We also continue to provide and develop our enrichment offer both through our curricular and extra curriculum provision.
